## RE: IMPORTANT NOTICE OF PARKING LOT CLOSURE

On Tuesday, August 1, 2017 at 7:00 AM the Library Parking Lot, located between East Jefferson and East River Streets will be closed to traffic as major reconstruction is tentatively scheduled to begin. **Please note that vehicles left in the parking lot on Tuesday, August 1, 2017 will be towed at the owner's expense.** Construction is expected to be completed by October 31, 2017. While parking will not be permitted during the construction, all businesses are open. Normal trash collection and deliveries will be accommodated to the best of our abilities.

As a resident, where should I park?

Residents with parking permits will be allowed to park overnight along East River Street, just south of the Opera House parking lot, please see attached map. Parking permits must be hanging and visible in vehicles. Please note that vehicles left in the Library Parking Lot will be towed at the owner's expense.

What can I expect during the construction?

The Library Parking Lot will be going through major reconstruction to better accommodate parking, improve traffic flow, and increase pedestrian-friendly walkways. As with any large construction project, residents can expect increased noise, dust levels, and daily inconveniences. The City advises all pedestrians and vehicles to use caution while navigating around the construction area.
