



# NOTICE - BOIL WATER ADVISORY

**DATE: October 8, 2020**

**TO:** Residents Near W. Jefferson  
(Indicated on Map)

**FROM:** City of Grand Ledge, Public  
Service Department

On Friday, October 8, 2021, a water main break on near W. Jefferson Street has affected water pressure for a select area of residents and businesses. This incident has caused the City to issue a boil water advisory until further notice. Crews are working to repair the break. Please refer to the following information regarding a boil water advisory effective immediately.

**To whom does this apply?** Grand Ledge residents and businesses as noted in the shaded area of the map.

**Boil your water before using:** Bring tap water to a rolling boil, boil for one minute,

and cool before using, or use bottled water. Boiled or bottled water should be used for drinking, making ice, washing dishes, brushing teeth, and preparing food until further notice. NOTE: From the Centers for Disease Control (CDC) regarding water usage and COVID-19. Tap water can still be used to wash hands when a Boil Water Advisory has been issued. If soap and water are not available, use an alcohol-based hand sanitizer containing at least 60% alcohol.

**If my utility has issued a Boil Water Advisory, can I still use tap water to wash my hands?** —

In most cases, it is safe to [wash your hands](#) with soap and tap water during a [Boil Water Advisory](#). Follow the guidance from your local public health officials. If soap and water are not available, use an alcohol-based hand sanitizer containing at least 60% alcohol.

**What is being done?** The City of Grand Ledge is working with the Department of Environment, Great Lakes & Energy (EGLE), formally known as the Michigan Department of Environmental Quality (MDEQ), to monitor the situation.

**The City will provide an update on Sunday, October 10, 2021, upon receiving results from the first required EGLE testing. Residents/Businesses in the affected area will receive an ALL CLEAR or BOIL EXTENDED notice on their homes.**

**How long will the advisory be in effect?** The City of Grand Ledge will conduct required EGLE certified laboratory tests to ensure water meets State of Michigan standards. Two consecutive water sampling tests will be completed at 24 hours and 48 hours after water pressure is restored. The tests will indicate whether the boil water advisory should remain in effect or if it can be lifted.
